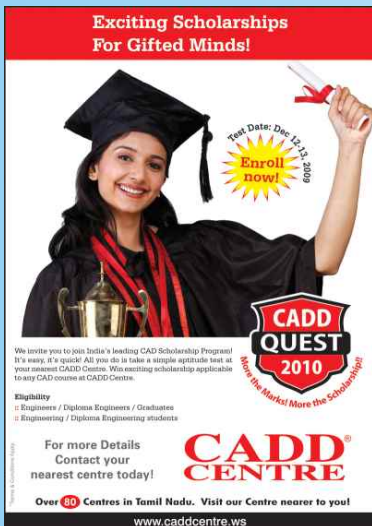

CADD Centre holds this merit-based scholarship exam for the thirteenth consecutive year to reward outstanding talent and provide affordable CAD education to professionals and students of all engineering streams. It is a one-hour exam conducted once a year by all CADD Centres across the country during December to March regionwise. The exam comprises tests of general knowledge, English and Maths, besides psychometric test for intelligence, aptitude, and personality traits.

"The response to CQ 2010 has been growing every year. Compared to 2008, there has been about 20% increase in student enrollments for the current year's exam. Apart from professionals and students having diploma/degree in mechanical, civil, architectural,

CADD Centre has so far trained over 5 lakh students in CAD, CAE, CAM. Every year, it trains close to 50,000 students - out of which about 10% are corporate employees - on CAD skills from engineering to project management to 3D visualization.
